SLU 1818 Advanced College Credit (ACC) Courses:

These courses are dual credit college courses. Chaminade students may choose to take the course for college credit or simply for credit toward high school graduation. Regardless of the choice the student makes, the course rigor and

student expectations are designed as a college course and compare to the rigor and expectations placed on students enrolled in the same course on the Saint Louis University campus. These courses are taught in affiliation with Saint Louis University. Chaminade faculty is adjunct instructors of Saint Louis University who are highly trained and accountable to maintain university standards.

If a student opts to take an 1818 ACC course for college credit, the grade they earn in the course will be recorded on an official Saint Louis University transcript. If a student enrolls as an undergraduate at Saint Louis University upon graduation from Chaminade their 1818 ACC college credit courses count towards their cumulative undergraduate GPA, and do not require a transcript request from SLU. 1818 ACC college credit may also be transferrable to other universities by requesting a transcript from Saint Louis University. Students are highly advised to check with their College Counselor regarding the transferability of the credit to an institution other than Saint Louis University. Chaminade students registering for 1818 ACC courses are rewarded with full access to university libraries at the time of their studies. Students may register for both fall and spring semester courses.

In order to be eligible for dual credit courses, participating students are required to be in full compliance with the MDHE - Missouri Department of Higher Education following requirements:

- a) Juniors and seniors must have a minimum 3.0 GPA on a 4.0 scale and electronic approval of the 1818 course instructor or 1818 Partner Coordinator
- b) Sophomores are eligible to enroll in 1818 courses in certain circumstances, to include 1818 courses in foreign languages (courses 1010 or above). Sophomores may be approved to enroll if the students have:
 - completed the pre-requisite course (s) with a grade (s) of “B” or higher and
 - provide a signed letter of recommendation from the principal and guidance counselor attesting the student’s suitability to take this course for college credit and
 - provide written permission from a parent or legal guardian and
 - electronic approval of the 1818 Partner Coordinator.
- c) Freshmen are eligible to enroll and participate in 1818 courses if:
 - the student meets the required 3.0 GPA
 - the student has scored in the 90th percentile or above composite score on his most recent standardized test
 - the student receives parent and school permission using the 1818 Advanced College Credit Parental permission form; all required forms should be completed and submitted to the 1818 HS Coordinator.
