William D. Coby, Jr. 1995

Basketball: 9-12, Captain 11-12; #4 all-time in points (1,590) behind only Tatum, Beal and Lee; #2 all-time in rebounds (976) behind only Tatum, #1 all-time in blocked shots (278) ahead of Tatum (200), Tied for #23 all-time in steals (71) tied with Lee and Ferrara.

As a sophomore, Second Team All-State, Third Team All-Metro, First Team All-Central District Second Team All-Conference and First Team All-Metro Journal.

As a junior, Honorable Mention All-Metro and Second Team All-Central, First Team All-Metro Catholic Conference and Second Team All-State.

As a senior, averaged nearly 20 points per game, Metro Catholic Conference Player of the Year. Held the record for most points in a single game (40), eclipsing Bob Van Uum '60 (38). Broke Hall of Famer, Derek Falb's career scoring record. Named All-Metro and Second Team All-Missouri. Nominated to play in the McDonald's All-American game.

Scored over half of Chaminade's points in the District Playoffs.

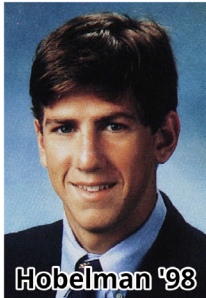

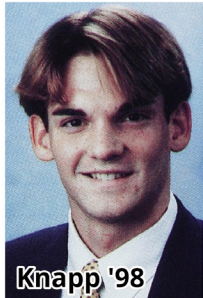

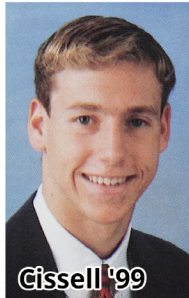

The 1998 Swimming Relay Team
*(presented by Kevin Brennan '71,
Coach of the 1998 Swimming & Diving Team)*

The 1998 Swimming and Diving team enjoyed their best finish since the 1984 State Championship team. Chaminade captured the gold medal in the conference championship, defeating SLUH and DeSmet, with Ed Murphy* (50 free) and Greg Cissell (500 free) winning individual gold medals.

At State, Ed Murphy '00, Greg Cissell '99, Bryan Knapp '98 and Brian Hobelman '98 chose to forgo individual events to form a most formidable relay team. For the first time in history, Chaminade won all three relays, and for the first time, these three events were won by the same four-member relay team. The State meet ended with the Red Devils earning the bronze medal – a 36-place jump from the worst finish in team history the previous year.
